

## *Pinus sylvestris Watereri*

### Dwarf Scots Pine



*Pinus sylvestris Watereri Umbrella 1.5-2.0m CG*

*Pinus sylvestris Watereri* is a slow growing, compact cultivar of *Pinus sylvestris*. It reaches a maximum height of 3-6m, with it usually growing broader rather than extending its height.

Due to the slow growing nature of the *Pinus sylvestris Watereri*, it is a tree that is ideal for being pruned rendering it excellently suited for shaping, for example it lends itself to creating Bonsai specimens.

The *Pinus sylvestris Watereri* offers interest throughout the seasons with the clusters of small cones amongst the stiff and twisted steel blue coloured needles contrasted with its orange-brown bark.
