



# *Salix sepulcralis Erythroflexuosa*

## Erythroflexuosa willow



*Salix sepulcralis Erythroflexuosa* 50-60cm standard CG

There is something very unique about the *Salix sepulcralis Erythroflexuosa*. Its irregular growing habit and pendulous, twisting branches look stunning in all seasons.

Leaves first emerge slightly yellow, turning to a fresh green in summer. During the autumn, the foliage changes to golden yellow before the leaves drop and reveal the contorted nature of the branches.

Due to its beautiful orange-yellow bark, *Salix sepulcralis Erythroflexuosa* is often pruned or pollard to maintain its ornamental size. Being only a maximum height of around 8 metres, it is a smaller variety of willow, perfect for smaller gardens or being used as a specimen tree.

Best grown in almost all soils, ensuring it is moist and free draining.

**Common Name:** Erythroflexuosa willow

**Family:** Salicaceae

**Height:** 6.0-8.0m

**Width:** 4.0-6.0m

**Demands:** full sun or partial shade

**Soil:** Moist, well drained

**Foliage:** Deciduous, twisted leaves. First emerge yellow before turning fresh green. Change back to yellow in autumn before falling.
